What is Awana?

The Awana Club program is made up of several smaller clubs.

Sparks for boys and girls in grades K-2.

T’n’T for boys grades 3-6

T’n’T for girls in grades 3-6.

Why is Awana?

The average Sunday school offers no more than 25 hours of Bible teaching a year; Awana provides youth additional time to learn about the Bible.

What happens at Awana?

Clubbers sing, learn and recite Bible verses, receive awards, and enjoy games, and snacks.

Who is Awana?

More than 30 trained adults from the church are involved with the two Clubs.

When is Awana?

All clubs meet on Wednesday night from 6:30-8:15 PM.

Please don't drop your Clubber off before 6:15 PM.

Awana takes a break each Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Awana announces weather cancellations over WHO (1040) radio.

New to the Awana program or moving from Sparks to T’n’T?

Your Clubber will bring home an entrance test: the first step in the programs.

Help your Clubber complete the test during the following three weeks.

Next your Clubber can **start earning awards**.

Not new to the program?

Encourage your Clubber to complete the handbook within the Awana year.

Cost of Awana?

Facilities and equipment are provided by the church

Clubbers are asked to bring weekly dues of .50 a week.

Save with single payment of \$15, which could be divided into two payments.
